

Cathedral Of The Wild: An African Journey Home



Synopsis

Boyd Varty had an unconventional upbringing. He grew up on Londolozi Game Reserve in South Africa, a place where man and nature strive for balance, where perils exist alongside wonders. Founded more than eighty years ago as a hunting ground, Londolozi was transformed into a nature reserve beginning in 1973 by Varty's father and uncle, visionaries of the restoration movement. But it wasn't just a sanctuary for the animals; it was also a place for ravaged land to flourish again and for the human spirit to be restored. When Nelson Mandela was released after twenty-seven years of imprisonment, he came to the reserve to recover. *Cathedral of the Wild* is Varty's memoir of his life in this exquisite and vast refuge. At Londolozi, Varty gained the confidence that emerges from living in Africa. "We came out strong and largely unafraid of life," he writes, "with the full knowledge of its dangers." It was there that young Boyd and his equally adventurous sister learned to track animals, raised leopard and lion cubs, followed their larger-than-life uncle on his many adventures filming wildlife, and became one with the land. Varty survived a harrowing black mamba encounter, a debilitating bout with malaria, even a vicious crocodile attack, but his biggest challenge was a personal crisis of purpose. Located just west of Kruger National Park, it is a world-famous private wildlife preserve that attracts international visitors and broadcast-media attention. Varty recounts how his family restored dry, overgrazed land abandoned by ranchers, establishing a healthy habitat for a wide range of wildlife, including elephants, lions, impalas, baboons, and crocodiles. This entertaining family saga is filled with distinctive characters, especially the authorâ ™s uncle John Varty, an irrepressible filmmaker who has survived numerous life-threatening accidents and clashes with business partners and government officials. Like his uncle, the author has cheated death, having been cornered by a poisonous cobra, held by gun-bearing robbers, and attacked by a crocodile. I truly loved this book, and gave it four stars instead of five only because of a certain unevenness in the overall memoir. But it tells a wonderful story- of a young man growing up in South Africa to a family of dedicated conservationists, encountering predators on a daily basis, learning about the natural world in an intimate way that is sadly unusual in the 21 st century. The story of Varty's upbringing and of his family is extremely engaging, amusing and original, and he draws a lovely, complex portrait of each family member. The relationship he had with his father is particularly well-drawn in the early chapters as the author describes an intimacy based on facing danger together , working together closely on a daily basis. In the mid-section of the book, I became a bit irritated by Varty's somewhat repetitive stories of his adventures with his uncle, a wildlife film maker who would heedlessly put his nephew into unwarranted danger for the sake of his films. Varty seems not quite able to offer a perspective on this man that encompasses both his love and

admiration, but also anger or distress about the insistence that being a man requires signing on for absolutely unnecessary danger. Later in the memoir, however, in a most affecting manner, the author describes his coming to terms with traumatic episodes in his life and with changes in his and his family's situation that require an acceptance of his vulnerability. He also discovers again and again his reverence for living in nature, and his commitment to conserving it. Varty's writing about nature is thought-provoking, enchanting... and simply beautiful.

This book is so much more than stories of a young man growing up on a family game reserve in so Africa -those stories are charming and paint a picture of an Africa long gone but the real story is of a family's growth and commitment to the land and the animals. It is also the story of the authors deeply spiritual journey from a dark place to light. I highly recommend this book to anyone who likes to go beyond the superficial.

What a fascinating book. The author writes about not only himself but of his amazing family and the journey they have gone through, first as hunters and then into conservation as they developed an almost unusable piece of property, into a thriving game preserve, called Londolozi, situated on the western border of the Kruger National Park, which together with some other parks make up the Greater Kruger National Park in South Africa. Theirs is a story of hard won victories in conservation and the battle to prevent species from going extinct. Today, Londolozi, the family land and safari headquarters, is one of the most elite and sought after safari sites in South Africa. In my view Varty has had a lot of good placed on his table, but to his credit he is humble in the telling of a long journey to the place his very tight-knit and loving family enjoy today.
