

Hemmer does a great job of leading the reader through the root problem of sin. Then pointing him to man's only hope - the REAL Jesus Christ of Scripture. And then encouraging the reader to live as a real man, standing (or rather, kneeling) confidently in his baptismal identity. So check your ego at the door, man up, and read it! I highly recommend this book to everyone.

I won't lie to you. When I first read the title for this book, I wasn't sure I would read it since "Man up" has become such a clichéd phrase. Concordia Publishing House made an extremely wise move, though, in making Pastor David Petersen's foreword available online before the book came out.
