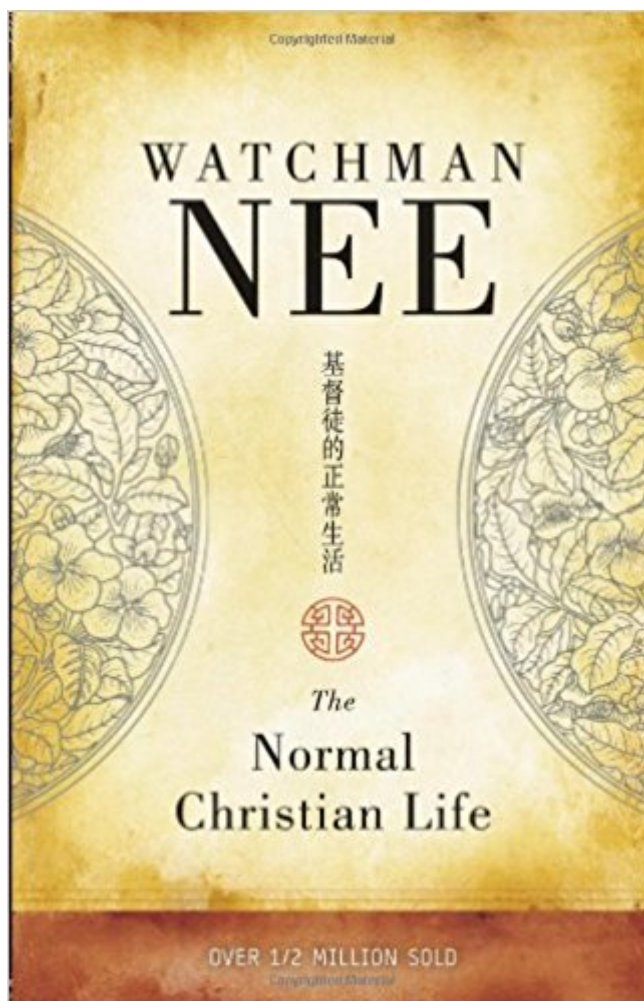

My thought is similar to Watchman Nee's concern though, that many of us would take this to heart, but continue in our ways trying to make it happen, or turning it into our own ministry with our own rules and beliefs. Oh, that we would let the Holy Spirit lead. There is no division of the church or the Body

of Christ except on the basis of Location. I think Watchmen Nee makes a very good case for this in this book.

I'm 40 years....raised going to church Sunday morning/night and Wednesday. Once I left for college, I disregarded it all because I lacked a relationship with Christ. Christianity seemed like drudgery and a boring set of rules to follow. After 10 years of self-destructive living, I turned back to God out of desperation. I then experienced God's grace, intimacy, and redemption power in relationship with him for about 5 years. However, it seemed like the more "churched" I got, the farther away God seemed. I finally began to understand that I was trying to earn His approval and had gone back to my "roots" of Christianity that I learned as a child...."don't do this, don't do that, be good, be happy, act Christian". Ugh....what a waste of time! After a few years of that junk, God answered my prayers and led me to read and listen to teachers that ministered God's grace like Watchmen Nee and Joseph Prince. This book was an eye opener for me (and my husband). It is an easy listen but not simple. My relationship with Christ is new and deeper than ever AND my marriage is better. I have since gotten all Nee's books on audible.com but this one is my favorite.

IMHO, a very engaging, personal, yet profoundly deep and insightful book about the apostle Paul's epistle to the Romans, and also a unique and precious exposition of the practical steps, changes in heart and focus, and results of the transition from living by the natural man to Christ living in us. I would certainly recommend this book as part of any serious study of Paul's letter to the Roman believers.

This was a very deep book that calls Christians to move so much deeper in their walk with the Lord. Step by step he leads us through our problem of sinfulness and redemption followed by the chipping away of our worldly values by pain and suffering with the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This is not a book for people who want God to bless their worldly decisions. This is a book to help the true seeker of the Lord to understand God's plan and purposes for each believer. Meaty stuff.

Watchman Nee is truly an anointed teacher of God's word.
