

Fascinating story of the mathematical quest to establish the size, mass, dimensions of our planet, by pioneers of geophysics. I gave my copy to a friend who loves it.

The author is clearly an expert in his subjects' fields, so much of his descriptions of their meticulous work might be lost on the reader who, like me, is not a geographer, not an astronomer, and possesses only rudimentary math skills. Even so, I could not put this book down. The drive to measure the world precisely, to figure out where exactly everything is, makes sense, but the actual painstaking process of doing that is something I admit to never having given much thought before, and here it comes across both clearly and compellingly. The wonderful characters who propelled this effort forward are described sparingly but precisely; the early deaths of crabby, racist, complex-ridden mathematicians should not feel like tragedy, but in this book they do. And because this book details the actual measuring processes - processes not included in other histories of geography and cartography - it fills a unique niche. I'm very glad I read it.

A remarkable book, addictive notwithstanding the huge amount of historical facts that the author displays packed in nearly 280 pages. Every page is full of data for the human struggle for knowledge in the XVIII century. Highly recommendable.
