With more energy than a party of second graders hyped up on birthday cake, the characters on the Wild Bunch soccer team get themselves in and out of trouble, chapter after chapter for an exciting ride to the last page. The kids are totally relateable, and totally serious about their soccer. Their passion is wonderful to watch, and things get even better when their parents try to control them. There's no controlling this Wild Bunch, and while the kids do things that would make any parent flinch, these are just good kids caught in the grip of their uncontrollable passion for soccer. Kevin, the star striker, leads off the series by challenging the best soccer team in their area to a match. Afterwards, the team wonders how they can beat the Unbeatables when they don't even have a coach. Enough said about the plot, just know that it's a page-turner. Kevin, the ball-hog, and his pals were raring to get outside and play soccer. Kevin, Danny, Tyler (his bro), Alex, Julian, Roger, Diego, and Joey began to pummel their walls shooting at imaginary goals. BAM! The excitement began to mount until things began to break and they got grounded. Everyone that is except for Roger who was watching in helpless disbelief as the giggling daughters of his mother's friends put curlers in his red hair. It was no great loss because he was a lousy player anyway. The Wild Bunch was looking smack dab into the faces of trouble. Mickey, Humungous Henry, Octopus, Jaggenaut Jim, Mow-down, Kong, and Rick the Grim Reaper were going to hammer those measly midgets into the ground. The game was set, the deal was struck. The winner was going to be able to keep the field forever. Dozer kicked the ball and hit the wooden fence so hard that one of the planks splintered into a thousand pieces. The Unbeatables might have been losers, but they were much older, bigger, and some nasty. The only hope for The Wild Bunch was a coach named Larry, a guy with a bum leg who reeked of beer and wore an eight-day-stubble. Did they have a chance or were they going to get ground into the field like unwanted ants at a picnic? This is the start of a great series that every young soccer fan is going to

go wild over. The reader will love the refreshing realism of the story and chuckle over some of the language and phrases. For example, when Kevin got mad at Larry he yelled out, Kiss my cleats. One of the boys is also homeless, living in a car and can't afford cleats, doesn't have a jacket, and has a mother who drinks. The story is full of fun, humor, excitement, and just the right amount of drama to keep even the most reluctant reader kicking his way through these pages to find out what happens in the end. If you don't already know, The Wild Soccer Bunch is a worldwide children's book phenomenon, having sold over 9 million books in 30 countries! Writer Joachim Masannek based the series on his own experiences as soccer coach to his young sons. Masannek's initial idea was to create a series of 13 books, each one narrated by a unique member of the team. This idea was inspired by his belief that soccer is the most inclusive of all team sports. In fact, Masannek said, in soccer, every member of the team, regardless of his/her athletic ability, has an opportunity to be directly involved in the game. Everyone gets to run around, kick the ball, and enjoy their time outdoors. Masannek could never have anticipated the huge success that followed the release of the debut book in the Wild Soccer Bunch series in Germany. Soon, this soccer dad's artistic endeavor had millions of fans around the world, not to mention the wild success of book sales, films, and even merchandise. In fact, Masannek has written and directed five Wild Soccer Bunch feature films, breaking box office records in the process. These days, Masannek tours extensively, personally reading the books to underprivileged children across the world. If your child goes to bed wearing soccer cleats so they won't miss one minute of field time in the morning, he or she will fall in love with the Wild Soccer Bunch. And even if he or she is not the world's biggest fan, the book's universal themes of teamwork, leadership, diversity, and self-acceptance will still make an impact, and maybe even get them out and kicking a ball around! The series is a great way to introduce boys and girls alike to soccer, or any team sport; above all, the series is a fun read that will broaden the horizons of all kids, ages 8-14. Joachim Masannek, Born in 1960, studied German and Philosophy in college. He also studied at the University of Film and Television; worked as a camera operator, set designer and screenwriter in Films and TV. His children's book series The Wild Soccer Bunch has been published in 28 countries. As the screenwriter and director of the five The Wild Soccer Bunch movies, Joachim has managed to bring about nine million viewers into the theatres. He was the coach of the real Wild Bunch soccer team, coaching his sons Marlon and Leon.

This is one of the few kids' books that I can wholeheartedly endorse for a boy. The book itself is nominally about soccer, but it really takes the reader and transports them to a different world - one where kids are at the center and the rest revolves around them. The characters are exaggerated in accordance with how a child would likely view the world, of course, so that the good ones are really good, the bad ones really bad. Everything that's going on in the book assumes an out-sized importance, just like a child's view. In that way, the book appears well-positioned to captivate a child who's reading it - the book speaks a child's language, looks at the world through a child's eyes. I've read plenty of children's books at this point, and this book is one of the few that really accomplishes that feat. The result is simple - my son has a hard time putting it down. Period. And given that he doesn't usually like to read, and he can't stand some of the books that are assigned to him in school, that's quite an accomplishment. I would further note that although this book was originally written in German, to German kids, it has been seamlessly adapted to an American audience. It reads as if originally written in English, and it's set in Chicago. Another nice aspect of the book is that it definitely encourages activity - via soccer, of course, but I think that kids who play other sports might be inspired as well. The only concern I might have would be for younger girls - this is really a boy-oriented book, as a whole. If you are considering getting a book for a 9 year old (or maybe younger) boy, then you can't go wrong with this, especially if he's a soccer player. For girls, I think it's more of a judgment call.

My grandson loved this book. He's 8 and a half and eats, lives and breaths soccer.

I am a middle school librarian and the students absolutely love the first book in the series "Kevin the Star Striker". There is nothing else like this series that I can find that is readable and appealing to the low and average reader middle school students. The Matt Christopher soccer books just do not have the same appeal. My question to Sole Books is "When are the other books going to be released?" On , it said that the 2nd book, "Diego the Tornado" would be released Dec 2010, but it is not available on or anywhere that I can find. The Sole Books website also lists a 3rd book in the series, but has no additional information about release dates or where to purchase the books. The students keep asking me when more books in the series will be coming out.
