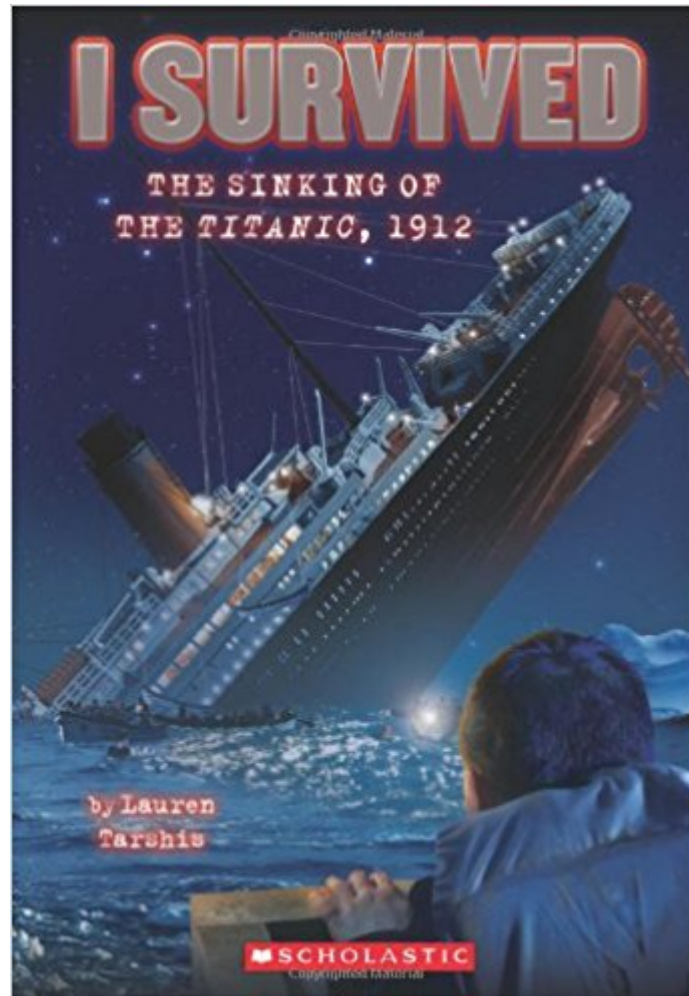

I bought this kindle book for my 12-year-old grandson. He read it rather quickly it, which says a lot. He's a very good reader but a very picky reader. The story has to be genuinely engaging for him to

read it. So, based on my grandson's review, I've given it four stars. Bear in mind that book reviews (like movie/play reviews) are based heavily on opinion. Other reviewed items have concrete qualities that the user can point out to validate the review. However, given the subject matter of this book, it's probably a good read.

Rather than picking up a boring history book, pick up a copy of an I survived book, because that will interest readers a lot more than a textbook. Even now, whenever we are learning social studies in class about a historical event such as the destruction of Pompeii, I will go home and read Laurens book from beginning to start to get a better understanding of the topic. Laurens books are historical, cultural, relatable and pure amazing, so go read the book because you haven't lived until you read the I survived series

Our 7 year old grandson is hooked on this series.. He doesn't choose to read - but this book definitely kept his interest and attention.
