

Gr. 8-11. This title in the new Social Issues Firsthand series probes a topic that will weigh heavily on many teens in the shadow of hurricane Katrina. In four major sections, including "The Working Poor," anchored by an excerpt from Barbara Ehrenreich's excellent adult book *Nickel and Dimed* (2001), 16 accounts from poverty's gritty trenches evaporate easy assumptions about the poor, and reveal the obstacles faced by stricken individuals and families hampered by catch-22 social policies, entrenched racial inequities, and logistics such as cleaning up for an interview: "Cleanliness for someone living in a car is a labyrinthine ordeal." The solace several speakers draw from Christianity gives some of the essays an evangelical tone, and the "Helping the Poor" section features individuals (a nun, a psychiatrist) whose secondhand perspectives seem out of place. The sum effect, though, is that of a bitter wake-up call, and though most essays were written before 2000, they're still plenty relevant today.
